Following the Light – Sheikh Ali Abbas Malik

1. Meaning of "Light" in the Qur'an

- The Qur'an repeatedly uses the metaphor of *nur* (light).
- This *light* is not just physical light (photons perceived by the eyes), but a **spiritual illumination**, visible only to the heart.
- Allah is Himself called Nur ("Allah is the Light of the heavens and the earth").
- Blindness of the heart, not of the eyes, prevents people from perceiving this divine light.

2. Light as Guidance

- Light enables us to see, understand, and distinguish truth from falsehood.
- The Prophet is described as "siraj munira" (a radiant lamp). He both possesses the light and spreads it to others.
- His complete submission to Allah makes him the purest vessel of divine illumination.

3. Following the Prophet # and the Nur with Him

- Believers are commanded to:
 - 1. Believe in the Prophet #.
 - 2. Support him.
 - 3. Follow the *nur* revealed with him.
- The *nur* is understood to be:
 - o The Qur'an.
 - o The Ahl al-Bayt عليهم السلام, who continue the Prophet's guidance after him.
- The Prophet said: "I leave behind two weighty things: the Qur'an and my Ahl al-Bayt."

4. Historical Context & Lessons

- After the Prophet's victories (e.g. conquest of Makkah, battles of Hunayn and Tabuk), Islam spread rapidly, but challenges also arose from hypocrisy and disobedience.
- True supporters (like the Ansar) sacrificed comfort for faith, motivated by the beauty of the Prophet's message.

• Others spread Islam outwardly but lost the inner flame of sincerity.

5. Obedience and Submission

- Real faith requires taslim (submission) to divine commands without hesitation.
- Complaints about prayer, fasting, hijab, or other obligations reveal inner hardness of the heart.
- Allah swears that belief is incomplete until believers accept the Prophet as final judge without resistance.

6. The Tragedy of Karbala as Preservation of Nur

- The light of Allah was opposed by those who sought to extinguish it.
- The martyrs of Karbala (Imam Husayn عليه السلام, Ali Akbar, Qasim, Abbas, companions) sacrificed themselves to ensure the light of truth survived.
- Even when their bodies were cut down, their radiant example illuminated history.

7. Concluding Reflections

- The *nur* revealed with the Prophet is life-giving, like the sun that sustains all living beings.
- This nur remains among us through the Qur'an and the Ahl al-Bayt عليهم السلام.
- Believers must strive to gather and live by this light, rather than being distracted by the fleeting glitter of dunya.
- The lecture closes with a prayer to be among those who truly submit, follow the divine light, and remain loyal to the Prophet ## and his family.
