

Lecture Summary – Wednesday 5th November 2025

"Those Who Hurt the Prophet" – Shaykh Ali Abbas Malik

Reflects on the life, tragedy, and spiritual station of **Sayyida Fatima al-Zahra (sa)**, emphasising her suffering, her role in preserving the truth of Islam, and the responsibility of the believers in honouring the Ahlulbayt (as).

1. Opening Prayers & Duas

- Begins with repeated salawat for blessings, acceptance of prayers, and intercession.
- A special dua is requested for a sister who is ill in hospital and for all those unwell.
- Duas are also offered for the elevation of the ranks of departed believers.

2. The Martyrdom of Lady Fatima (sa)

- Underscores that **there should be no doubt** that Sayyida Fatima (sa) **did not die a natural death**; she left this world as a **shaheeda**, killed by a group of individuals.
- Her martyrdom represents the greatest hurt inflicted upon the Messenger of Allah (saw).

3. Respect, Love, and Reverence for the Ahlulbayt

- While people may learn facts about the Ahlulbayt, true connection requires the heart to feel their honour and grief.
- On such nights, believers should focus entirely on her remembrance, setting aside personal joys or distractions.
- Her name must be mentioned with **dignity and reverence**, not casually.
 - A story is shared of a scholar who, even on his deathbed, sat up when he heard her name out of respect.

4. The Unique Status of Sayyida Fatima (sa)

- Although Maryam (as) was honoured in the Qur'an, her role was limited to being a daughter and a mother of Isa (as); she was not a wife nor did she leave a broad "sunnah."
- In contrast, Fatima (sa) left a complete model of:
 - Daughter
 - Wife
 - Mother

- She was not given a sibling, but Allah granted her **Sayyida Zaynab** (sa) as a daughter so her example of sisterhood could also be completed.
- Imam Ja'far al-Sadiq (as) is quoted describing her greatness as **beyond full comprehension** an "elusive enigma" known only to the infallible.

5. Her Mission After the Prophet's Passing

- In the short period after Rasulullah's (saw) death, Sayyida Fatima (sa) **exposed the injustices** that occurred:
 - o The seizure of Fadak
 - o The betrayal of key individuals
 - o The silence of bystanders
- Her **Khutbah al-Fadak** revealed:
 - The deviation of the ummah
 - The hypocrisy of political leaders
 - o The abandonment of the Prophet's family
- Many converts to the path of Ahlulbayt throughout history cite Fatima (sa) as their starting point.

6. Qur'anic Framework: Love vs. Harm to Allah and His Messenger

- The speaker ties the tragedies to Qur'anic verses:
 - o Sending salawat vs. causing **adhaa** (harm) to Allah and His Messenger.
- Hurting the Prophet (saw) includes:
 - o Disobeying him
 - Disrespecting him
 - Harming his family
- Those who harm the Prophet receive Allah's curse in this world and the next.

7. Historical Examples of Disrespect to the Prophet (saw)

The lecture cites multiple incidents from hadith and seerah illustrating:

- People raising their voices above the Prophet (saw)
- Individuals questioning his commands
- The refusal of many to join **Usama's army**, despite the Prophet's explicit order
- The Prophet expressing sorrow—almost to death—over people's rejection, hypocrisy, and disobedience

These collectively demonstrate the **pattern of disrespect** that culminated in the tragedies after his passing.

8. The Tragedy of Sayyida Fatima (sa) After Rasulullah (saw)

- The confiscation of her property, her rights, and her titles.
- The attack on her door, which the Prophet (saw) used to greet with salaam.
- Her broken rib, discovered only by Imam Ali (as) while preparing her body for burial.
- Her loneliness and lack of supporters despite her father being the Prophet.

9. Her Secret Burial

- Fatima (sa) requested:
 - A nighttime burial
 - o That those who oppressed her **not attend** her funeral
- Imam Ali (as) buried her secretly, fulfilling her will.
- He mourned deeply, recognising her as his greatest support in worship and life.

10. The Continuous Sorrow of Fatima (sa)

- She cried constantly after the Prophet's death, leading the people of Medina to ask her to cry either by day or by night.
- Imam Ali (as) built **Bayt al-Ahzan** for her grieving.
- At the grave of her father, she recited lines highlighting her overwhelming burden of grief:
 - o "Such tragedies have befallen me, that if they fell upon days they would turn them into nights."

11. Her Vision of Future Tragedies

She foresaw the calamities that would befall her children:

- Imam Hasan (as) poisoned, vomiting his liver
- Sayyida Zaynab (sa) enduring unparalleled trials
- Imam Husayn (as)—she saw:
 - o The arrow to his forehead
 - o The severed finger for his ring
 - The dagger striking his neck 13 times

Yet her daughter Zaynab (sa) would face even greater restrictions:

"Whenever she wished to cry, they told her there was no time—neither day nor night—to weep."

Overall Message

The lecture is a reminder that:

- Understanding Fatima (sa) is key to understanding the true Islam.
- Her life exposes the divergence of the ummah from the Prophet's teachings.
- Believers must honour her with heart, reverence, and loyalty to the Ahlulbayt.
- Remembering her tragedies is a form of safeguarding faith and recognising truth from falsehood.
